PG students also contributed as co-authors with the faculty in the Book 'Khoj Sanvaad'. One student also presented paper in International Seminar at Khalsa College for Women sponsored by ICSSR. 7. Internal examination system was upgraded by adopting online/offline mode where required. The results of internal examination were communicated to the students and on the basis of feedback, remedial and intensive study classes were arranged to ensure better performance of students in university examinations.

Development Programs for teaching and non-teaching staff

1. The College organized FDPs/ Workshops to upgrade the knowledge and skills of faculty as follows: i) Webinar on IPR and Patent Process in association with Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Intellectual Property Management (Government IPR Training Centre), ii) Two Day Online FDP on 'Inspired to be an Inspiration' iii) IQAC of College organized Three Days 'Advanced Workshop on Data Analytics ' in collaboration with Business Research Plasma 2. The financial assistance was enhanced and provided to the tune of Rs 11,204 In the year 2021-22 to faculty members for attending workshops, refresher courses, orientation programs etc. 3. Liberal on-duty leave

and lecture adjustment was granted to the faculty members for attending seminars, conferences, orientation programmes and FDPs. 4. Faculty members were encouraged to contribute towards writing books or chapters in books in their respective areas of specialization and resultant 13 faculty members contributed in the form of research articles and books & journals. 5. The College organized 'Health and Hygiene Awareness Session' for the support staff of the College to guide them regarding maintenance of personal hygiene. 6. The policy for payment of honorarium of Rs. 1000 p.m. to IQAC Coordinator has been initiated.

### Holistic Development of Students

1. Frequent meetings were held with the members of Placement Committee and Moral Education Forum to assess the need of students and to design appropriate programmes, webinars, and Competitions and hence Workshop on Critical Thinking, Talent Show 'Majlis', Business Quiz, Money Matters-Economic Quiz, Online Workshop on IPR, Webinar on 'Financial Literacy and Weekly lecture on Moral education were organized.

2. To encourage ecological

conservation practices among students, activities like Workshop on Swachhta Action Plan, Tree Plantation Drive, Awareness Programme on

Awareness Programme on Environment and its Importance, Seminar on Save Soil Movement, Sessions on Save Soil Conscious

Planet Movement, Cleanliness Rally were organized by the College. 3. Student Council was entrusted the task of getting inputs from new and old students regarding the kind of assistance needed for their professional and personal development and accordingly 7-Days Online Workshop on Competitive Skills, Certificate course on Soft Skills, Lecture on Good to Great- A Pathway to Self- Development, Workshop on "Resume Writing", Workshop on "Digital Marketing Tools", Seminar on E-Learning Tools and Digital Platforms etc. were organized. 4. Lecture on Mental Wellbeing and Happiness, Webinar on Emotional Intelligence were conducted to address the issues of anxiety, mental health and other dilemmas of the students during post Covid period. 5. To provide placement opportunities and information related to employment and self-employment, the College collaborated with District Bureau of Employment and Enterprises (DBEE) and in the year 2021-22 a Session was conducted to guide the students towards the right career path. Further, Placement Cell of College organized 'Mega Placement Drive' in collaboration with DBEE where 21 companies including Kochartech, SBI Card, HDFC-Life, SBI Life, NIIT, Edelweiss, ICICI Bank, ADMONZ, Flipkart, PNB Metlife, Webberz, BYJUS participated in the drive for recruitment. 387 graduate and

post-graduate students participated in the campus interview drive. 93 students were shortlisted and 39 students were selected by the Companies. To provide more placement opportunities for students, Campus Placement Drive was organized in the College in collaboration with HDFC Life Insurance Company and 13 candidates were selected for the role of Associate Agency Business Manager. 6. Entrepreneurship Cell was established in the College in the year 2021 with the motive to promote the spirit of entrepreneurship and leadership in the College students. It organized Seminar on 'Entrepreneurship: Roadmap to Success' and Expert Talk on 'Choosing Social Entrepreneurship over Entrepreneurship' by successful entrepreneurs in the industry to encourage the young generation for entrepreneurial ventures. 7. The progress of the students in terms of academic performance, behaviour etc. was regularly monitored by the respective teacher Incharges to assess the efficacy of various programmes. 8. To enhance collaborations with reputed firms for augmenting the placement and internship opportunities for the students MOU was signed with Medica Entreprises and Shakti Power Solutions Pvt. Ltd. 9. Rotaract Club was established in the College in the year 2021 with an intent to transform students

into responsible leaders who can bring desirable social changes by treading the path of moral and ethical values. Rotaract Club actively organized events like 'Light up the Diwali of the Needy', Children's Day Celebrations, Sessions on Save Soil Conscious Planet Movement, Spreading warmth this Christmas, Blood Donation Camp etc. 10. NSS Unit of the College which works with the objective of developing the personality and character of the students through voluntary community service remain active throughout year. It organized Talk on Nutrition for Healthy Young Women, NSS day-Relevance and Opportunities, Cleanliness rally (Under Clean India Programme), National Youth Day and National Girl Child Day as major activities. 11. College collaborated with industry and academia and thus, organized Seminars, Webinars, Workshops and Lectures to augment academia and industry interaction.

### 15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

SSSS College of Commerce for Women, Amritsar, being included in Section 2(f) and Section 12(B) of the University Grants Commission Act, follows the guidelines of Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar. It was established to educate young girls in career oriented courses in Commerce and allied streams. The College offers courses in Commerce, Economics and Computer Science and the academic pursuits lay special emphasis on building capabilities of the students in order to prepare them for Life. Skill development courses, Moral education programs, Community welfare projects, Environment conservation, Cultural and theatre based activities are integrated with the teaching learning practices in order to offer a comprehensive educational experience to the students. The recognition of such endeavours in the form of an official selection in the 10th Mumbai Shorts International Film Festival 2021 and winning accolade as the Best Screenplay gave further impetus to our aspirations for multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary progress. It is pertinent to mention that the theatre group of the College 'Niralam' has been organising various plays and events on the sensitive but culturally and socially relevant issues.

The multidisciplinary orientation of the College is reflected through various add on/bridge courses/guest lectures organised whereby students' exposure to the knowledge of languages, Environment Science, Information Technology, Mathematics, Theology, Health and Nutrition is ensured for a holistic development of their personalities. The College recognizes the need of the ever changing employment market and thus, workshops are conducted regularly for resume writing, personal grooming, interviews, communication and other soft skills.

Special efforts are made to broaden the horizons of the learners by inspiring them for the love of reading. Book fairs, reading clubs, book discussion sessions are held throughout the year where books of various genres, autobiographies, fiction, self-help and motivational books are highlighted. Furthermore, books and journals of various disciplines like Commerce, Economics, Management, Computer Science, Literature (Hindi, English & Punjabi), Religion, Spirituality and Competitive Examination are made available in the library. Thus, the focus has been on

unfolding students' abilities and to provide optimal conditions for the holistic development of the students.

The College believes in encouraging and empowering young women to be well-informed citizens. With the motive to provide value based education, a booklet 'Moral Education Forum' for Me, You and Us' containing the most precious gems to embellish human character: Ethics, Etiquettes, Manners has been published by the College and has now become part of the academic programme in the form of regular talks, group discussions, role plays, and most importantly the core of the institutional philosophy. Also, a short course in 'Business Ethics' is held for final year students so as to sensitize them for ethical conduct in their professional roles.

With regard to the multidisciplinary research endeavors, students were encouraged to write research articles on the real world open problems such as sanitation crisis and problems of public toilets, consumer shifting behavior in telecom sector, CEO remuneration and bank performance etc. in the college magazine 'Sifti'. This magazine has been in publication since 1996 and acts as the vehicle to foster innovation and reflects the multidisciplinary research inclination of the College.

Additionally, Projects such as 'Perception of Parents regarding the Challenges of the Child during Covid-19 Pandemic', 'Perception of Parents regarding E-Learning of School Students during Covid-19 Pandemic' and 'Study of Alumnae Life Satisfaction', undertaken by the Research Unit of the College, further represents the firm aptitude to support research and stimulate engagement in order to have sustainable solutions.

In tune with National Education Policy 2020, the College is committed to pursue every step to promote interdisciplinary approach in its functioning and practices. Addition of more degree courses or diploma courses is also being planned in order to advance the career options for the students. As applied learning being focused in NEP 2020, a practice worth mentioning is the encouraging initiative of the College to publish the first edition of the book 'Khoj Sanvaad' in 2022 whereby research articles on the topics like women empowerment, inclination towards organic products and self-help groups were included to break down subject silos. Thus, the College has traversed a long way in the endeavor to recognize challenges of the present education system and to promote quality in academics and research.

### **16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):**

Under National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, Indian government launched Academic Bank of Credits (ABC), a nationwide facility to promote flexibility in curriculum framework and academic mobility of the students. In concurrence with the requirements of Higher Educational institutions (HEI) regarding preparedness for NEP in context of ABC, Student induction programmes are being organized to create awareness among the College students about various learning pathways and career opportunities available with ABC facility.

As per instructions received from Affiliating University and UGC, registration process of College students for Academic Bank of Credits has been initiated so as to ensure digital storage and credit mobility of the academic credits earned by College students. This will enable the learners to avail the benefit of multiple entries and exit during the chosen programme. Students enrolled after the year 2021 have been instructed to create ABC account following the stated procedure. Moreover, students have been instructed to fill ABC id on all examination forms further onwards. Head from the Department of Computer Science of the College has been deputed as Nodal Officer to ensure proper implementation of ABC and conforming to all regulatory guidelines on behalf of the College.

To implement the ABC framework in letter and spirit, and with a view to make learners dexterous to adapt curriculum flexibility, endeavors are made to encourage the College faculty to adopt innovative pedagogical approaches and engage in multidisciplinary This move would ensure the seamless transition of students to the multidisciplinary curriculum with adroit faculty. To ensure this, faculty members of the College are encouraged to contribute towards publishing chapters in books, writing textbooks within approved framework and publishing research articles in journals of repute, resulting which 14 faculty members contributed towards publishing textbooks, chapters in multidisciplinary books and research articles. Thus, College is undertaking initiatives and necessary actions as per the guidelines to implement Academic Bank of Credits so as to build vibrant communities of scholars, peers thus enabling the students to become well rounded individuals.

#### 17.Skill development:

SSSS College of Commerce for Women, Amritsar envisions encouraging, endowing and empowering young women through skill oriented programmes relevant to regional and global dynamic employment market in an atmosphere radiant with professional work cultures and spiritual aura. The mission of the College is to create citizens equipped with knowledge, skills and values to build an inclusive, just and progressive society.

In order to develop skill set of students and to make them industry ready, certificate and value added short term courses are introduced from time to time. IQAC members along with the faculty members explore the gaps in the existing curriculum and requirement of add-on courses for students to enhance the value of these courses. In its effort to strengthen the vocational education and soft skills of students in alignment with National Skills Qualifications Framework, 'Certificate Course in Soft Skills' and '7-Days Online Workshop on Competitive Skills' were introduced in the year 2021-22. The faculty members outlined the syllabi framework for development of these courses launched in the College.The Collegealso offersBridgeCourseinCommunicationSkillsandComputerFundamentalseveryyearwhichhelpthestudentsto ace soft skills and enhance their digital literacy.

The college seeks to impart Value-based education and imbibe various life skills among the students to ensure their holistic development. With an intent to offer value based education, Moral Education Forum through lectures and discussions, course on 'Business Ethics' sensitize the students about ethical conduct required in their personal and professional roles. Thus, by organizing various activities and courses the College attempts to inculcate positivity amongst the students to ensure the development of humanistic, ethical, Constitutional, and universal human values of truth (satya), righteous conduct (dharma), peace (shanti), love (prem), non-violence (ahimsa), scientific temper, citizenship values, and life-skills. To further develop these skills amongst students, wide spectrums of activities are organized by the Sirjana Committee, Spark Committee throughout the year. 'Niralam- The Theatre Group of the College' directs and organizes activities and events focused on imbibing truthfulness and righteousness among students. Its unique way of presenting sensitive and pressing issues has won applauds at international level in the form of a short film directed by it selected at 10th Mumbai Short International Film Festival-21.

Furthermore to infuse ethical, Constitutional, and universal

human values amongst students', extension activities are regularly organized by NSS Unit and Red Ribbon Club. Moreover, Rotaract Club was established in the College in the year 2021-22 to enable the students to build leadership skills, expand education, build cultural values and learn the value of service. These units and wings organize range of activities throughout the year in the form of Tree Plantation Drives, Voters' Awareness Camps, Helping the Needy, Save Soil and Environmental Conservation etc.

The efforts are made by the College to make teaching-learning process more students centric to ensure that students identify their core interests and acquire relevant skills required for the job market. To make students aware about skills required in different industries, several lecture sessions, seminars, and workshops are conducted throughout the year. Sessions like 'Career Opportunities in Insurance Sector', Webinar on 'Financial Literacy', Session on 'Success Mantra for Government Competitive Exams' in the year 2021-22 gave glimpses of educational qualifications and skills required in different sectors.

The College collaborates with reputed firms, engage services of Industry veterans and Master Crafts persons to provide vocational skills to students and fill the gaps between theoretical education and practical knowledge. Thus, it organizes webinars, interactive sessions and discussion sessions for augmenting academic interaction, placement and internship opportunities that students need for their professional and personal development. These included the themes like Transforming Education, Talk on Nutrition for Healthy Young Women, Good to Great- A Pathway to Self- Development, Critical Thinking, and Environment and its Importance.

As per NEP-2020, the College endeavours to strengthen the skillset of students to make them dexterous to take up professional careers. Thus, it attempts to integrate learning through various skill enhancement programmes such as Course on Communication Skills, Accountancy Skills and Employability Skills. It is pertinent to mention here a practice that the College follows to inculcate life skills and values among the students to enable them to sustain and grow in global scenario. In context of this, a booklet titled 'Moral Education Forum' for Me, You and Us' which portrays institutional philosophy has become an integral part its academic programme. The Moral Education Booklet comprises general code of conduct indicating Ethics, Etiquettes, and Manners and is reinforced to make it

practicable through regular lectures and discussions. Another practice worth mentioning here is the encouragement and facilitation for Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) by the College to its students. It enable the students to polish their skills and enhance their proficiency in multiple disciplines, so that they can sustain and grow in contemporary world. In this context, the College offers opportunities and required facilities to the students for attending the MOOC Courses at Udemy, Coursera and Spoken Tutorial Project of IIT Bombay. Thus, the College is undertaking every possible initiative to strengthen the skill set of the students to ensure their seamless transition from mainstream education to industry ready professional.

### 18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

The College believes and follows strategies for integrating Indian Knowledge System (IKS) within existing educational frameworks as prescribed by the affiliating University, Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar. Besides, efforts are made for charting future courses of action in the form of SSSS Vision Document and NEP, 2020 as per the New Education Policy-2020. For instilling knowledge of India and its varied social & cultural values, and technological updations, its inimitable artistic, language, and knowledge traditions, and its strong ethics in the minds of young women students, varied learning activities are planned and conducted throughout the academic session using blended mode of teaching-learning. For instance,

Although all students at under-graduate and postgraduate levels have opted English as the medium of instruction for the degree and certificate courses, yet teachers explain and simplify the concepts trilingually (English, Punjabi/Hindi).

All students and teachers begin their day by reciting the prayer in chorus in the classroom to seek the blessing of Almighty for performing the righteous deeds. Teachings of Global Religions, Sri Guru Granth Sahib and Bhagwad Gita in the form of 'Ethical Values' and 'Business & Management Paradigms' are incorporated during teaching learning process that bring students from the Commerce, Computer, Economics, Language and Mathematics Department closer to their cultural ethos, expand their intellectual horizons and enhance their confidence.

For connecting the learners, students and teachers, with the knowledge of the language, culture and heritage of India, and

especially the state of Punjab, various events (like Rashtriya Ekta Divas, Mathematics Day, National Youth day etc.), rituals (like observing Sankranti every month and ensuring the distribution of Parsad amongst all students, arranging Community Kitchen once a year, covering head at the time of honouring the guests, etc.) and festivals (like Diwali Mela, Lohri, Makar Sankranti, Christmas etc.) that create a praxis of habits and hence, bring knowledge into learners day to day actions and are celebrated with full zeal and enthusiasm.

For appreciating cultural roots, students and teachers not only ferret out information enshrined in ancient texts but also incorporate ancient knowledge systems in modern education in the form of research papers, and books. The publication of books like 'Our Heritage: A Reflection on Global Religions', 'Moral Education Forum: For Me, You and Us', 'Sikh Heritage' and research paper titled 'Ethics in Business: A Way of Life (A Few References from the Religious Teachings of the World)' are the results of such endeavours. The books are published in Punjabi, Hindi and/or English.

College has a well established Moral Education Forum, a project to inculcate ethics, etiquettes and manners. For incorporating knowledge of Indian Culture and Heritage, and especially Punjab, Punjabi and Punjabiyat, the library has literature books (810 books in Punjabi language, 66 in Hindi language, 850 in English language, 02 in Urdu language) and Religions(161 books). Language days like Hindi Divas and Punjabi Divas are also celebrated. Assimilating the best of the western culture while retaining indigenous traditions as well is also evident from conduct of talks, seminars, role plays, theatrical items performed; for instance the debut film 'Curtain Falls'.

College Hall Rose Villa and Library are housed in heritage building of SSSS.

### 19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

The College heeds by an Outcome- based Education (OBE) framework to ascertain the attainment of course outcomes and program outcomes. To provide lucidity of purpose of teaching and learning, appropriate and comprehensible learning objectives for the programs and courses are explicitly outlined and displayed on the College website. The faculty also deliberates over the

learning outcomes with the learners at the commencement of the semester. The College assesses the attainment of Course Outcomes through the class tests, quiz tests, mid-semester and university exams, co-curricular activities and feedbacks of students. The College keeps a track of outgoing students and monitors their advancement to further education and their placement in various organizations. Activities in or outside the classroom are designed in such a manner that benefit every stakeholder from the OBE framework.

With an aim to foster abilities and values needed for life and work in global economy, the College organizes the sessions for the students of all the courses to inculcate the core skills, develop digital literacy and to make them globally aware citizens with knowledge so that they can address issues of human and environmental sustainability. Workshops for the preparation of various competitive examinations are conducted every year to encourage, guide and groom the aspirants interested in prospective careers. To infuse the students with spiritual, social, moral and cultural values, positive ethos are modeled by the College throughout the session thereby equipping them with intelligences and attributes to succeed throughout their lives. Reiteration of ethics, etiquette and manners that embellish human character from the booklet, 'Moral Education for You, Me and Us'- a publication of the College has been made an integral part of our academic program. Assessment 'of' and 'for' learning tools are also aligned with the learning outcomes as specified for each subject of a given course. For instance, for the seminars and projects assessment for learning is done on the basis of predetermined criterion.

As per NEP-2020, the gap between the current state of learning outcomes and what is desirable must be bridged and it's pertinent to mention here that the College follows the practice of offering Bridge Course in Communication Skills and Computer Fundamentals at the commencement of session every year to help the students hone better communication abilities and familiarize them with the use of basic computer skills. The course also helps the students to have deeper and more meaningful insights and prepares them for the interview environments in the ever changing global society.

#### **20.Distance education/online education:**

a) College has adequate facilities and resources to offer vocational courses through ODL mode. However, currently the affiliated colleges have not been permitted by the affiliating

university to offer such courses.

b) i) Development and use of technological tools for teaching learning activities:

SSSS College of Commerce for Women strives towards personalized learning for students. Integration of technological tools along with conventional ones has made the teaching learning process more effective and productive at the College Campus. Teachers incorporate various technological tools viz. computer based (use of ICT / presentations), games based (live quiz), YouTube videos/tutorials, MOOCs etc. to increase student engagement and enrich the teaching learning process.

To fill the gap occurred by suspended classroom teaching due to the global pandemic, College made a transition to digital teaching and learning. For this, College has signed up for Google Workspace for Education Fundamentals, a suite of easy-to-use educational tools, with the following benefits:

- ? Collaboration in real time with Docs, Sheets, Slides, Forms and Jamboard
- ? Communication with learners from anywhere with Google Meet, Chat, and Gmail
- ? Helping teachers save time with Google Classroom by easily creating courses, organizing classwork, posting and grading Assignments as well as sharing feedback
- ? Reducing workload by enabling teachers post and schedule coursework

Faculty Development Programmes were conducted to impart training to faculty for ICT based teaching using various online educational tools as above.

Electronic resources such as e-books and e-journals viz. Drishtikon: A Management Journal and International Journal of Business Analytics and Intelligence are made available in the Library for the faculty as well as students.

ii) Institutional efforts towards blended learning:

Students and faculty are motivated to enroll in Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) on various platforms (Coursera, Udemy,

SWAYAM etc.) in order to upskill themselves. As an initiative, the College has collaborated with IIT Bombay to be a part of its Spoken Tutorial Project wherein teachers and students earn certifications in diverse areas viz. Computer Fundamentals, Python and C++ programming languages, Libre Office, Linux Operating system, Front Accounting and many more. The students are mentored by faculty and the College bears the entire cost of the courses opted.

Furthermore, short-term courses, seminars/webinars and workshops based on students' interest and skill gap analysis are a special feature of the Academic Calendar. To name a few, Webinar on Transforming Education (for career orientation); Certificate course in Soft Skills, Workshop on Digital Marketing Tools, Online Workshop on Competitive Skills, Webinar on Wonderful Conversation (for enhancing soft skills and computing skills); Online Workshop on 'Intellectual Property Rights and Patent Process' (creating awareness regarding rights of content creators); Webinar on Financial Literacy, Webinar on Financial Independence Program (investor education); Webinar on Emotional Intelligence and Lecture on Mental Wellbeing and Happiness (health consciousness) were organized during the academic session.

College has also incorporated a blend of online and offline instruction for the students of Postgraduate courses solving the scheduling issues faced by the graduates doing internships or part-time jobs.

Hence the use of technological tools and blended learning is bringing positive outcomes and making the environment more innovative for the learners.

#### Part B

#### **CURRICULAR ASPECTS**

#### 1.1 - Curricular Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

The college provides an appropriate teaching-learning environment that ensures effective curriculum planning and its implementation in a systematic and organised way. The College is affiliated to Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar and hence, follows its rules and guidelines regarding the assessment and evaluation process of performance of students. At the commencement of new session, the modus operandi of the internal as well as external examinations is explained to the students.

Considering assessment as a vital touch stone, the College recognizes evaluation as a benchmark for efficient teaching learning process. The students are apprised about the criteria for the internal assessment at the beginning of the semester. To assess Financial Accounting (Tally) practical, Corporate Law and Secretarial Practice practical and seminars, internal assessment is carried out by the College faculty. #### 2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, timebound and efficient

A well-systematized mechanism for the grievances related to the examination is followed by the University and the College. Grievances pertaining to the discrepancies in the question papers of University examinations are reported to the University. ### 6.1.2 - The effective leadership is visible in various institutional practices such as decentralization and participative management.

The College follows decentralized governance and participativestyle of management. During years 2021 and 2022, university communicated its decision to conduct semester examination through online mode.

In order to successfully execute this format, a hierarchy of faculty comprising Principal (as Coordinator), Deputy Coordinator, Superintendents and Supervisors was formed. This was not a routine task for the faculty. Hence a core team comprising two members from Computer Department and one from office staff was constituted to chalk out a plan covering all steps right from communicating to the candidate regarding steps of receiving question papers and sending answer sheets. For the private candidates, a helpline was maintained to handle their examination related queries.

An invigilation duty list was circulated among staff members acting as Supervisors. The responsibilities of members involved were as follows:

- Superintendents further mailed them to supervisors who further forwarded the question paper to the students of their respective class.
- • Supervisors were also responsible for receiving the complete and correct pdf of answer sheets.

#### Solid Waste Management

The Institution takes proper measures for the collection, transportation, treatment, and disposal of degradable and non-degradable waste. The College believes in promoting 5 R's of Zero Waste Living i.e. Refuse, Reduce, Reuse, Recycle and Rot in letter and spirit. Students are encouraged to use reusable items for reducing the amount of paper and plastic waste. Solid wastes encompassing food waste, canteen waste, plastic and glass bottles etc.are collected every day by the Municipal Corporation of Amritsar. Tree leaves are transformed into fertilizer using composting technology within the college campus. The College uses digital platforms to reduce the usage of paper for communication and sharing documents. Paper wastes are disposed off through vendors.

#### Liquid waste management

All waste water lines from toilets are connected with Municipal drainage mains. Timely repair of these water lines and sewerage system is ensured. Plants are watered using the waste water from air conditioners.

The E-waste is collected & stored in the store room. Empty toners, cartridges, outdated computers and electronic items are sold as scrap to ensure their safe recycling. Old monitors and CPUs are repaired by the college technician and reused.
